This Sunday, called, from the first word of the Introit, *Laetare* Sunday, is one of the most solemn of the year. The Church interrupts her Lenten mournfulness; the chants of the Mass speak of nothing but joy and consolation; the Organ, which has been silent during the preceding three Sundays, now gives forth its melodious voice; and instead of purple, Rose-coloured Vestments are allowed to be used. On this day, the Church bids her children to *rejoice!* Our fasting and abstinence are now more than half over. Let us, then, rejoice, and spend this day with the light-heartedness of pilgrims, who are near the end of their journey. The happy moment is advancing, when our soul, united and filled with her God, will look back with pleasure on the fatigues of the body, which, together with our heart's compunction, have merited for her a place at the Divine Banquet. - *Dom Prosper Guéranger*, *The Liturgical Year*.

We **welcome the Archbishop** to the parish this weekend as he conducts a pastoral visitation.

All are invited to the annual **Chrism Mass** at the Cathedral on Thursday 21 March at 7:00pm. The Cathedral car park is available from 6:00pm, and a light supper will be served following the Mass.

Flyers for the **St Patrick's Day Dance** next Saturday 16 March are at the church doors.

The Feast of St Patrick is transferred to Monday 18 March due to falling on a Sunday. In Australia, it is a solemnity, and as such we relax our fasting on this day to celebrate. Mass times are the usual schedule.

The Feast of St Joseph is on Tuesday 19 March. This is also a Solemnity. In addition to the usual Mass times, there will be High Mass at 6:30pm.

We hope to have news soon on our request to the Archbishop to sell the St John Fisher land to the St John Henry Newman College, for the purpose of establishing a primary school on the site. The College will eventually have a high school which will be located on another site, hopefully not too far away from Tarragindi. As has been stated previously, the parish and the College have agreed that the parish will continue to offer the present three English Masses each week on the site, even after the land is sold to the College. When the school eventually opens, there may be additional school Masses for the benefit of the students and staff. An anonymous flier that has been seen makes the assertion that there will be four weekend Latin Masses on the site. Please note that this is a false claim. It should also be noted that the St John Henry Newman College is a private company, run by a board of lay people. Any claim that the Oratory is purchasing the St John Fisher land is also false.

Please note that any literature left, without approval, in our churches or at St Elizabeth's Chapel will be removed.

FIRST READING | 2 Chronicles 36:14-16,19-23

PSALM | Psalm 136(137):1-6

By the rivers of Babylon there we sat and wept, remembering Zion; on the poplars that grew there we hung up our harps.

For it was there that they asked us, our captors, for songs, our oppressors, for joy. 'Sing to us,' they said, 'one of Zion's songs.'

O how could we sing the song of the Lord on alien soil? If I forget you, Jerusalem, let my right hand wither!

O let my tongue cleave to my mouth if I remember you not, if I prize not Jerusalem above all my joys!

SECOND READING | Ephesians 2:4-10

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! God loved the world so much, he gave us his only Son, that all who believe in him might have eternal life. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

GOSPEL | John 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: 'The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son. On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil. And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'

COMMUNION ANTIPHON

Jerusalem is built as a city bonded as one together. It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord, to praise the name of the Lord.
