Feast of Christ the King | Plenary Indulgence

On the Feast of Christ the King the Church encourages us to join in a public Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus by offering a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions. Pope Pius XI instituted this Feast and Consecration because Christ “is the author of happiness and true prosperity for everyone and for every nation. If rulers of nations wish to preserve their authority, promote and increase the prosperity of their countries, they will not neglect the public duty of reverence and obedience to the rule of Christ. When people recognize, both in private and public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony.” We encourage you to join us for the public Act of Consecration which will be made during Vespers and Benediction.

QLD Election and Euthanasia

The following is an excerpt from a statement in the Cathedral Newsletter by Archbishop Mark Coleridge. “A couple of Sundays ago across Queensland we celebrated Dying Peacefully – No Euthanasia Sunday. Last Sunday, with impeccable timing, the Premier announced out of the blue that, if re-elected, the Labor government would rush euthanasia legislation before the parliament in February next year... The question of euthanasia is quite literally a matter of life and death; and there are no issues more important for a community and for individuals than those that touch life and death. They matter even more than politics. But the Premier’s decision suggests that politics trumps all else, that votes or support from key constituencies matter more than human life and human dignity. The contradictions abound. A government which has set great political store on closing borders to protect life now pushes legislation which jeopardises life. At a time when suicide is a national problem – especially among youth and First Nations people – the government wants to sanction suicide in law, saying that suicide in some contexts is an acceptable solution. The government may also claim that they want both better palliative care and voluntary assisted dying. But the assumptions underlying palliative care and VAD are so utterly different that they are in the end incompatible. A choice has to be made, and the one really human choice is properly funded palliative care.” The full statement can be read at www.cathedralofststephen.org.au.
