In thanksgiving for all the graces and blessings we have received this year, join us for Vespers and Benediction on **New Years Eve** Tuesday 31 December at 5:00pm when we will sing the Churches great hymn of thanksgiving, the Te Deum. A plenary indulgence, under the usual conditions, is available to all who join in the solemn singing of the Te Deum on New Years Eve.

Mass on **New Years Day** at 10:00am will be a sung Mass. There is a plenary indulgence granted, under the usual conditions, to the faithful who publicly sing the hymn *Veni Creator* which will take place after Mass to call on the Holy Spirit to bless the coming year.

Following the Masses on Friday there will be the Prayer in Reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Following the Mass on Saturday, there will be the Prayer in Reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

As announced at Masses last weekend, we are very pleased to announce that the Archbishop has given his permission for the **St John Fisher** site to be leased to St John Henry Newman College. Once the lease itself is signed and becomes effective, the College will begin refurbishments of the present buildings. When this work this starts, the Saturday 5:30pm and Wednesday 6:30am Masses will be celebrated, temporarily, at St Elizabeth's Chapel, until their return to the College site.

When receiving **Holy Communion on the tongue** it is very helpful for the communicant to close his/her eyes, as this prevents unwanted movement at the moment of receiving. Extend your tongue a little outside of your open mouth. Your top lip or teeth should not be touching your tongue, otherwise the Host may fall. Retract your tongue as soon as the Host is placed on it. In the Latin Mass, the communicant does not say anything. In the English Mass the communicant says "Amen" before the Host is placed on your tongue. In the Latin Mass, Communion is permitted only on the tongue.

Please note the following schedule changes this week: on Monday there will be one Mass only at 9:00am, followed by Confessions (NB no evening Mass or Confessions on Monday); and on Wednesday there will be one Mass only at 10:00am celebrating the Octave Day of the Nativity, with Confessions from 9:45am (NB no evening Confessions on Wednesday).

GOSPEL | Luke 2:41-52

Every year the parents of Jesus used to go to Jerusalem for the feast of the Passover. When he was twelve years old, they went up for the feast as usual. When they were on their way home after the feast, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem without his parents knowing it. They assumed he was with the caravan, and it was only after a day's journey that they went to look for him among their relations and acquaintances. When they failed to find him they went back to Jerusalem looking for him everywhere. Three days later, they found him in the Temple, sitting among the doctors, listening to them, and asking them questions; and all those who heard him were astounded at his intelligence and his replies. They were overcome when they saw him, and his mother said to him, 'My child, why have you done this to us? See how worried your father and I have been, looking for you.' 'Why were you looking for me?' he replied. 'Did you not know that I must be busy with my Father's affairs?' But they did not understand what he meant. He then went down with them and came to Nazareth and lived under their authority. His mother stored up all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom, in stature, and in favour with God and men.
