We invite you to join us for Benediction this Thursday at 6:00pm as we celebrate the feast of **Bl Salvio Huix Mirapiex of the Oratory**. Bl Salvio, then a Bishop, standing against the atheistic regime in Spain in 1936, was martyred with a number of the faithful from his diocese for refusing to renounce the faith of Our Lord during the Spanish Civil War.
