The Maxims and Counsels of St Philip Neri: "He who cannot put up with the loss of his honour can never make advance in the spiritual things."

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat. One full meal and two collations (light snacks) are permitted on Fast Days. Fasting, obliges those aged 18-59, and Abstinence obliges those over 14. Exceptions to the obligation include medicine, drinks, the physically or mentally ill, diabetics, and pregnant or nursing women. The other days of Lent are days of penance, excluding Sundays and Solemnities of St Patrick (17/3), St Joseph (19/3), and the Annunciation (25/3). On days of penance, the law is fulfilled by any of the following: prayer, self-denial (e.g. fasting or abstinence), or the spiritual and corporal works of mercy.

The **traditional and ancient discipline of Lent** kept the Fast all days of Lent except Sundays and Solemnities, and abstinence from meat on all Fridays. This traditional practice is laudable for those whose health permits.
