The Maxims and Counsels of St Philip Neri: If you wish to come where I am going, that is, to glory, you must come this road, that is, through thorns.

The Fathers and Brothers wish everyone all the blessings of Eastertide! Thank you to the many people who assisted in any way with the Holy Week ceremonies.

Holy Communion is reserved for practising Catholics in a state of grace, having confessed all unconfessed mortal sins and having kept the fast. Receiving Holy Communion signifies our union with the Catholic Church and belief in her teachings (e.g., Jesus is God, the Eucharist is His Body and Blood, abortion is murder, contraception is immoral). If you're an adult not receiving Communion, it is generally best if you remain in your pew, as priests are not permitted to give blessings during Communion. There is a general blessing at the end of Mass.

If you would like to **learn more about the Catholic faith** or the Sacrament of Confession, we'd be happy to talk to you. Please speak to the Fathers and Brothers after Mass, or get in touch with us via the Office or Oratory House.

After **Vespers and Benediction** today, all are welcome to present flowers to Our Lady rejoicing with her in the Resurrection of her Son.

Please note that Vespers and Benediction is on as usual at 5:00pm on Easter Sunday, but there is no 4:00pm or 6:00pm Masses. During the coming week of the Easter Octave there will be no evening Masses or Confessions.

GOSPEL | John 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.' So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
