Calling all men to attend the **Men's Rosary Crusade** on Saturday 1 August as part of the First Saturday Devotion to Our Lady's Immaculate Heart. Meet on the grass next to St Stephen's Cathedral for a 10:30am start. We will pray the Holy Rosary as a public display of our faith, and follow up with some food, drinks and fellowship at the Riverside Arms.

There will be a special **evening prayer event for vocations** on Thursday 6 August at the Cathedral from 5:30pm with Solemn Vespers and a Holy Hour, presided by the Archbishop, followed by a Vocations Expo in the Hanly Room.

The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Saturday 15 August is a Holy Day of Obligation. A Holy Day is a day on which the faithful are obliged to participate in the celebration of the Mass and to refrain from work or activities that hinder worship, rest, or the proper relaxation of mind and body (CCC 2185). Mass times will be 7:00am (Latin), 8:30am (English), 10:00am High (Latin).

After the morning Masses for the Solemnity of Our Lady's Assumption on August 15 we will have the **blessing of herbs**. You are invited to bring a bouquet of herbs/flowers from your garden to be blessed.

Q. Is it a sin to miss any part of Mass on a Sunday? A. If the omission be through one's own fault, it is a mortal sin to miss a notable part of Mass, and it is a venial sin to miss any part of Mass (*Catechism of Christian Doctrine*).

Please note that the Saturday 5:00pm Mass returns to St John Fisher on July 25. There will be no 4:00pm or 6:00pm Masses on August 2 and 9, and no confessions during the 10:00am Mass on those days. Confessions on Monday evenings will resume on 17 August.

GOSPEL | Matthew 13:44-52
