The Maxims and Counsels of St Philip Neri: There is nothing the devil fears so much, or so much tries to hinder, as prayer.

The Portiuncula indulgence may be obtained today. It is a special privilege to mark the day St Francis of Assisi dedicated the chapel he built through Christ's request. This plenary indulgence is granted, under the usual conditions of Confession (20 days either side), Holy Communion, prayer for the intentions of the Pope, and detachment from sin, to the faithful who devoutly visit a church and recite the *Our Father* and the *Creed*.

There will be a special **evening prayer event for vocations** this Thursday 6 August at the Cathedral from 5:30pm with Solemn Vespers and a Holy Hour, presided by the Archbishop, followed by a Vocations Expo in the Hanly Room.

The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Saturday 15 August is a Holy Day of Obligation. A Holy Day is a day on which the faithful are obliged to participate in the celebration of the Mass and to refrain from work or activities that hinder worship, rest, or the proper relaxation of mind and body (CCC 2185). Mass times will be 7:00am (Latin), 8:30am (English), 10:00am High (Latin). There will also be a Vigil Mass on Friday 14 August at 4:30pm at Mary Immaculate. Attendance at the 5:00pm Mass on Saturday 15 August can be used to fulfil your obligation for either the Assumption, or for Sunday, but not both. If you attend the Saturday 5:00pm Mass you will need to additionally attend any other Mass from Friday afternoon to Sunday evening.

Those coming to confession are asked to please be in the queue outside the confessional by the advertised start time. After the advertised start time has come, when the line finishes the priest will depart.

Communion on the tongue is greatly helped if the communicant has closed eyes, with their tongue extended over the bottom lip, with mouth open (i.e. tongue not touching the top teeth).

Some parishioners have asked for the **Spanish-Latin version of the 1962 Angelus Press Missal**. If you would like us to order one for you, please contact the parish office this week.

Please note that there is no 4:00pm or 6:00pm Masses on August 2 and 9, and no confessions during the 10:00am Mass on those days. Confessions on Monday evenings will resume on 17 August.

For I am certain of this: neither death nor life, no angel, no prince, nothing that exists, nothing still to come, not any power, or height or depth, nor any created thing, can ever come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GOSPEL | Matthew 14:13-21

When Jesus received the news of John the Baptist’s death he withdrew by boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But the people heard of this and, leaving the towns, went after him on foot. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them and healed their sick. When evening came, the disciples went to him and said, ‘This is a lonely place, and the time has slipped by; so send the people away, and they can go to the villages to buy themselves some food.’ Jesus replied, ‘There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves.’ But they answered ‘All we have with us is five loaves and two fish.’ ‘Bring them here to me’ he said. He gave orders that the people were to sit down on the grass; then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven and said the blessing. And breaking the loaves handed them to his disciples who gave them to the crowds. They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining; twelve baskets full. Those who ate numbered about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children.
